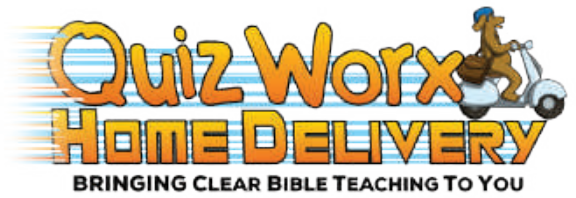


# How to Use Quiz Worx Home Delivery

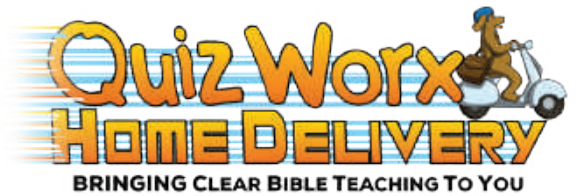
Each week Quiz Worx releases a new Kids' Talk video which can be used as part of an online church service or family devotion time. Each kids' talk comes with Activity Sheets, Game/Craft ideas, Discussion Questions and 'Digging Deeper' Family Devotions to help you share Jesus with the kids in your church and family. We pray this will be a blessing and encouragement to many kids, families and churches.

## **FOR CHURCHES:**

Here are some suggestions for making the most of the 'Quiz Worx Home Delivery' material as part of an online church service:

1. Pray
2. Ensure the kids and parents in your church have access to the activity sheets and discussion questions. Feel free to offer these directly from your church website, attach them to an email to church families, print them out and deliver/post them, or encourage them to sign up themselves at [www.quizworx.com/HomeDelivery](http://www.quizworx.com/HomeDelivery)
3. Play the Kids' Talk video towards the start of your service, either by including in your live or pre-recorded service, or by sending families a link to watch on YouTube.
4. During the sermon/teaching time for the adults, parents can encourage kids to work on the activity sheets, and possibly craft (if they can work on this unsupervised).
5. After the sermon parents can lead a short discussion using the discussion questions provided. Then families can play the suggested games together in their household or with other families online (e.g. via Zoom) and get hands-on with the craft activity.
6. During the week, families can use the 'Digging Deeper' Family Devotions together to explore God's Word further at a time that suits them.

## FOR FAMILIES:

Here are some suggestions for making the most of the 'Quiz Worx Home Delivery' material as a family:

1. Print off the Activity sheets, Game/Craft ideas and Discussion Questions & Family Bible Devotions ahead of time.
2. Pray together.
3. Play the Kids' Talk video – you can stream/download it directly from this google drive or watch it on YouTube link that is e-mailed to you each week.
4. **CHOOSE YOUR OWN ADVENTURE:** after watching the kids' talk, feel free to continue with any of the additional elements, in an order that works for you and your family.
5. Kids will enjoy the Activity Sheets which include colouring in, mazes, find-a-words and other fun activities. There is one provided for kids ages 2-4, 4-8 and for kids ages 9-12.
6. Parents can use the provided discussion questions to lead a short discussion any time after watching the kids' talk.
7. Playing games together or with other families online (e.g. via Zoom) and getting hands-on with the craft activity can help to reinforce the message of the talk (and should be a lot of fun too).
8. Families may choose to move right into the 'Digging Deeper' Family Devotions during this time or choose other times later in the week to explore God's Word further together (try and find a regular time that works with your family).

Ask God to help you to trust Jesus.

# Digging Deeper

## Family Devotions

### How to use 'Digging Deeper' for the 'The Peace of Christmas' videos.

To help you think more about the peace that Jesus brings, we have provided three devotions. We encourage you to read these passages with those in your household at a time that suits and use the questions to guide you as you talk about and reflect on Jesus this Christmas.

### Devotion 1 – Read Luke 1:26-38

In this passage, the birth of Jesus is announced by the angel Gabriel! What Good News!

1. What do we learn about who Jesus is and what he will do?
2. How does Mary respond to the amazing news?
3. Why do you think God sent Jesus to earth? What does this mean for you?

### Pray

Praise God for the incredible blessing of Jesus.

Pray for those in your life who don't know Jesus. Pray for boldness this Christmas to share the Good News of the Bible that Jesus, the Son of God and the King came to earth to make a way for people to be at peace with God by trusting him.



# Digging Deeper

## Family Devotions



### **Devotion 2 – Read Luke 2:1-21**

Jesus is born! The shepherds are the first to hear this Good News and there's a great celebration with the angels singing glory to God! It was Good News then, and it's still Good News today!

1. How do you think the shepherds felt when the angel appeared? How do you think they felt after hearing the angel's announcement about Jesus?
2. What did the angel announce about who Jesus is? What does it mean that Jesus is the Saviour and King?
3. How can you celebrate Jesus this Christmas?

### **Pray**

Thank God that we can celebrate Jesus' birth at Christmas just like the angels and shepherds did 2000 years ago.

Thank Jesus that he is the King of the entire universe and the one who came to save us so that we can be at peace with God.

### **Devotion 3 – Read Philippians 4:4-9**

This passage talks about how the peace that Jesus brings impacts our lives. The world is full of things that can make us feel worried and un-peaceful, but the peace that comes from God through Jesus will help you live in this world that can seem out of control and un-peaceful.

1. What makes you feel worried and un-peaceful?
2. How do you feel knowing that God cares about the things that worry you and promises to listen to your prayers and to help you.
3. How can these words in the Bible help you when things in your life seem scary, out of control or un-peaceful?

### **Pray**

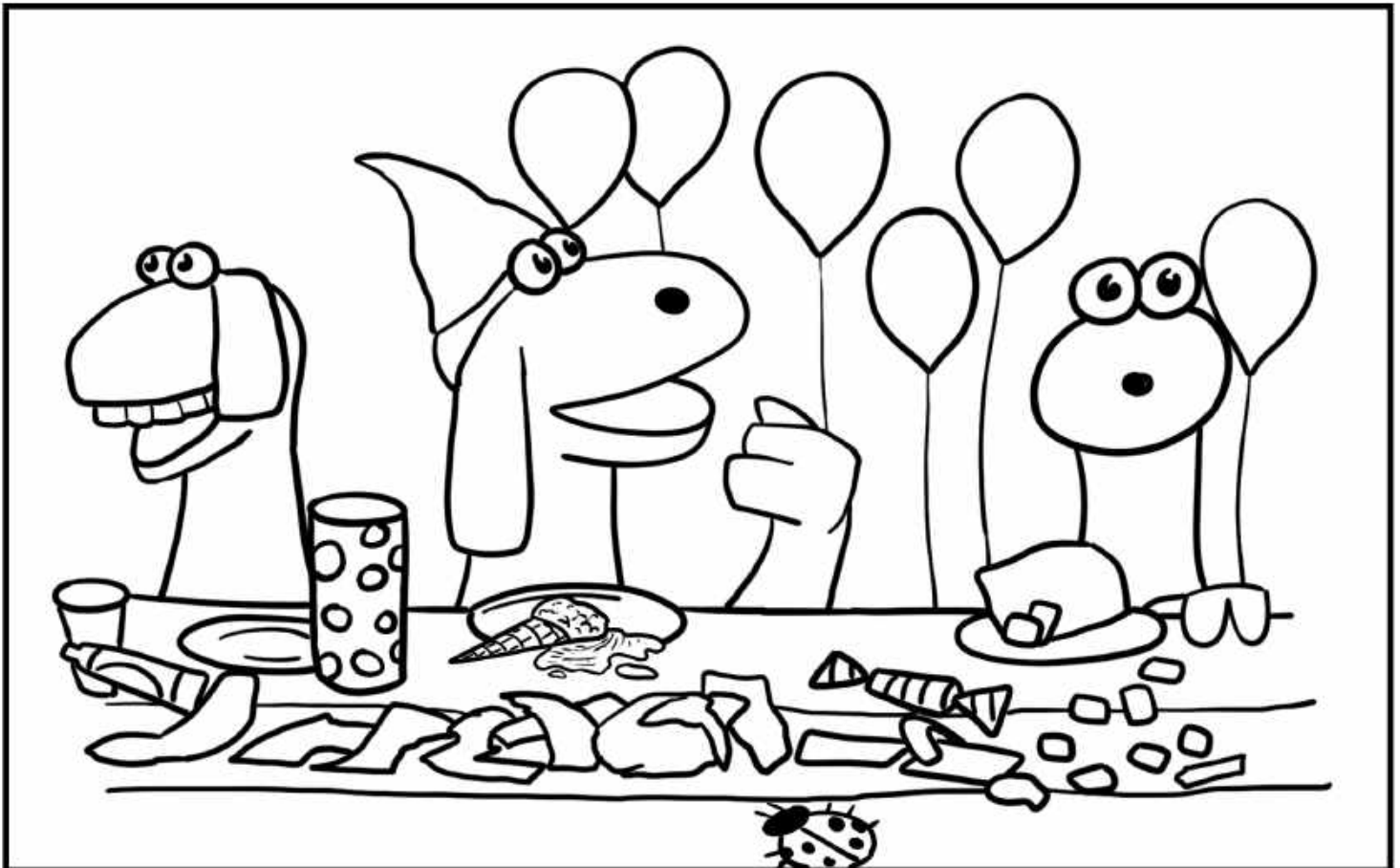
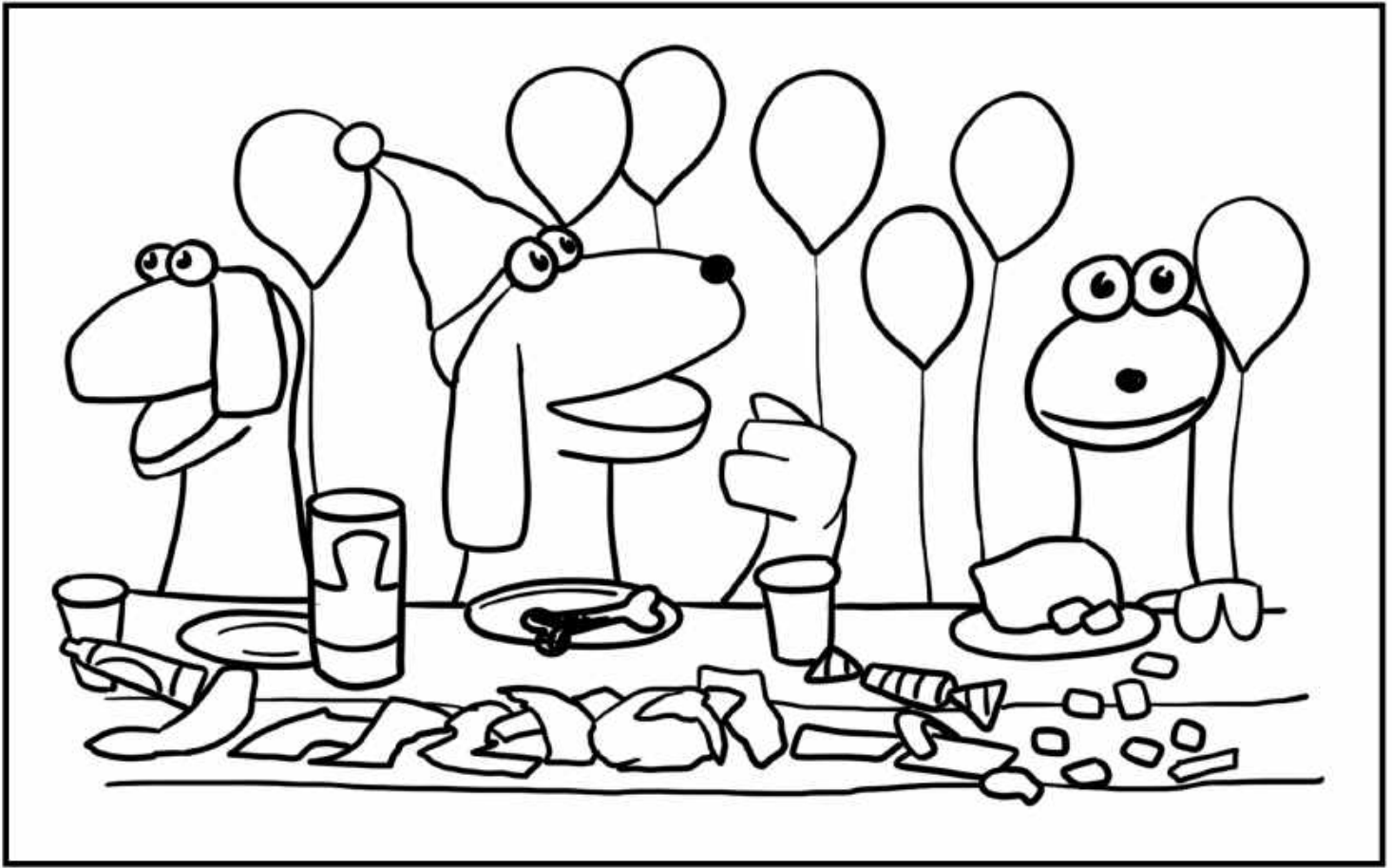
Thank God that he listens to you and promises to help you when you feel worried and un-peaceful.

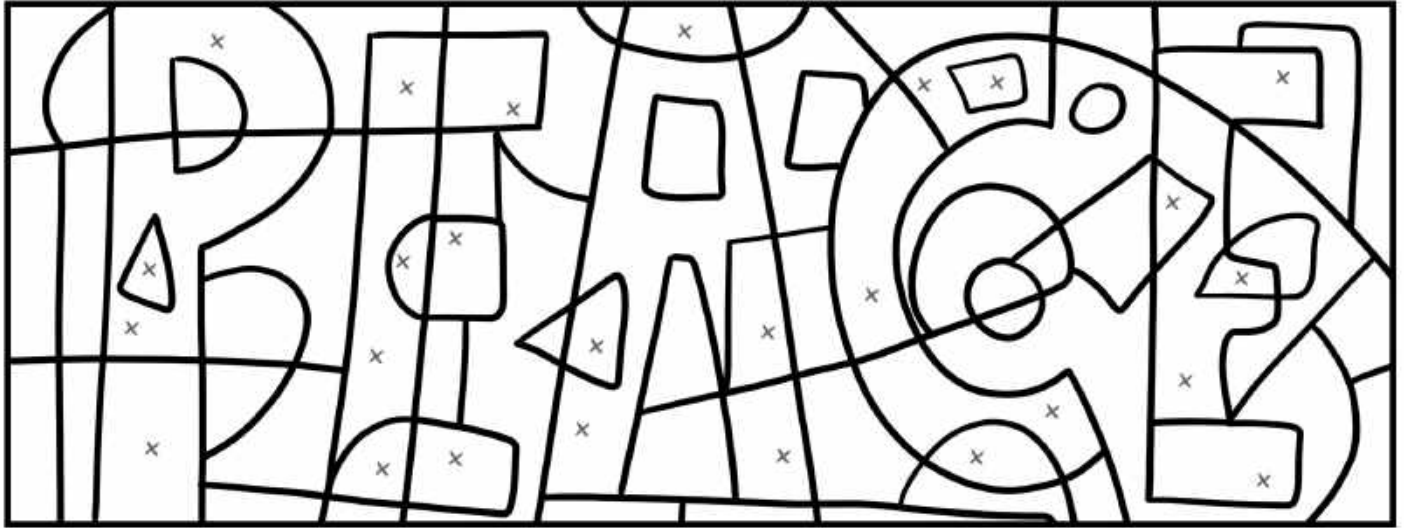

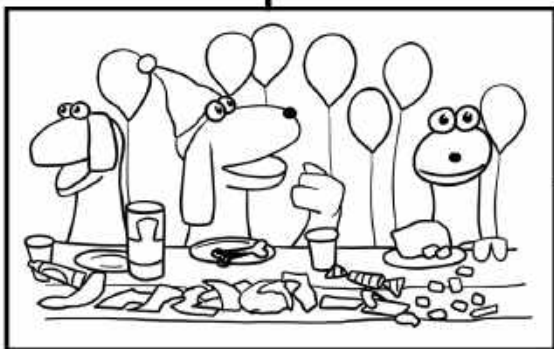
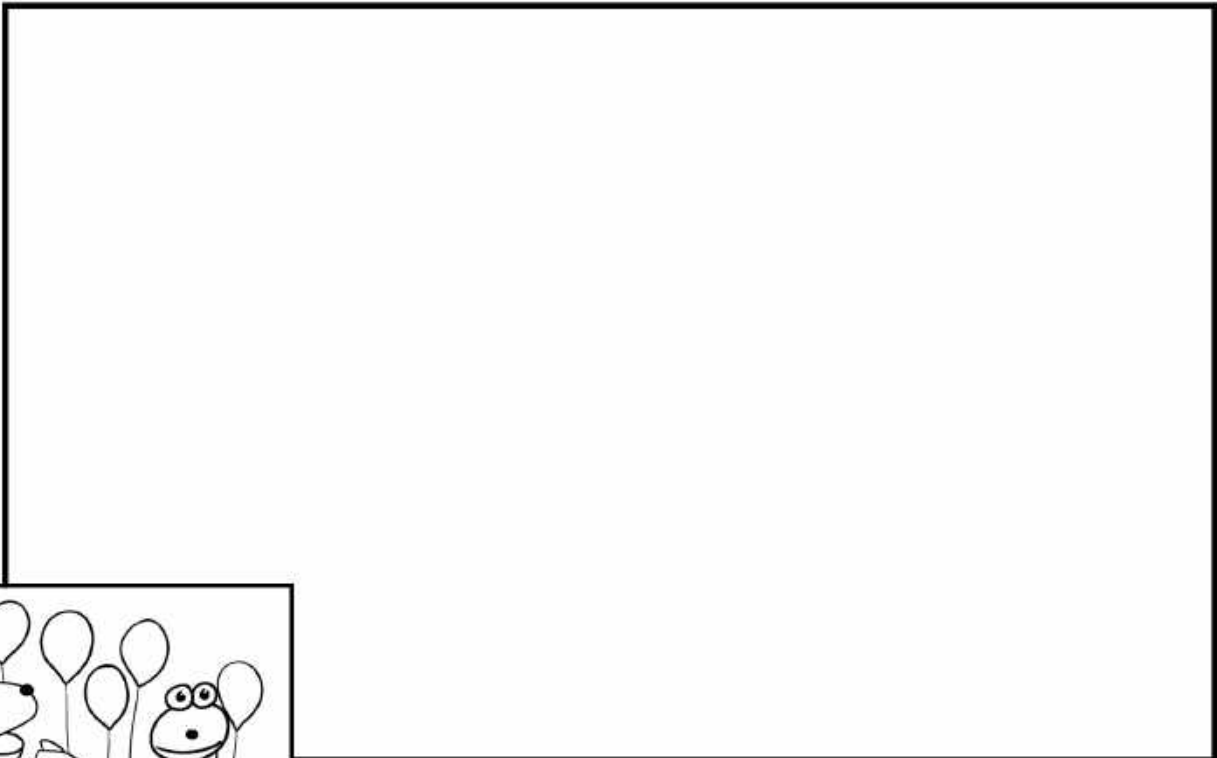

#### Craft Ideas

##### 1. Peace Wreath

Jesus brings PEACE!! Today, as we make this Christmas wreath, let's think about that AWESOME news!! And once finished, with the words "Jesus is the Peace Bringer" on the wreath, let's hang it somewhere to remind ourselves and everyone else who walks past that it is JESUS who brings REAL peace at CHRISTMAS.

#### You will need:

- 1 red ribbon, 60cm long (roughly)
- Dark green A4 pieces of paper/cardboard, 4-5 pieces (We shall be tracing hands, so if tracing an adults hand, use 5 pieces of paper, otherwise use 4)
- Light green A4 pieces of paper/cardboard, 4-5 pieces.
- 1 red piece of paper/cardboard (can be small)
- Pencil
- Permanent marker
- Safety scissors
- Glue



#### Instructions:

1. Use the pencil to trace hands on the pieces of green sheets.
2. Draw 20 hands, 10 on the light and 10 on the dark green sheets.
3. Use the scissors to cut the hand traces out (Make sure to supervise or have an adult cut the shapes out).

4. Place the hands so they form a circle, laying one on top of the other.



5. Glue the hands together. I glued the underside of one of the hands, just the palm. Then placed that hand on top of another. Set aside.



6. Draw 15 circles on the red paper.



7. Use the scissors to cut the circles out (Make sure to have an adult watch or cut the shapes out).
8. Use the permanent marker to write on the bottom of the wreath, "Jesus is the PEACE BRINGER!"
9. Use the ribbon to tie up the wreath onto your front door to remind yourself and everyone else who brings peace this Christmas.

##### 2. Christmas Bake Off

Angels, shepherds, and Jesus, oh my! In part 1 of the special Christmas video, we heard the Good News that Jesus came to bring peace. YOU can remember this story by making the people from the story out of gingerbread. What fun!

**Time:** 1 hr 30 min

#### You will need:

##### Supplies

- 2 bowls
- Stirring spoon
- Sifter
- Plastic wrap
- Parchment paper
- Two baking trays
- Rolling pin or a round cup
- Person shaped cookie cutter + angel + sheep if available. If unavailable, any other shaped cookie cutter will do or simply shape the dough with a butter knife

##### Cookies

#### Dry Ingredients:

- 1 ½ cup Plain Flour. *Healthy alternative:* white whole wheat flour or whole wheat pastry flour. **AVOID** wholemeal flour
- ½ cup + 2 tablespoons Sugar. *Healthy alternative:* vanilla creme stevia
- 1 ½ teaspoon Ginger
- ¾ teaspoon Corn-starch
- ¼ teaspoon Baking Powder
- ¼ teaspoon Cinnamon
- ¼ teaspoon Salt
- ⅛ teaspoon Nutmeg
- ⅛ teaspoon Cloves

#### Wet Ingredients:

- 2 tablespoons Unsalted Butter.  
*Healthy alternative* - melted coconut oil
- 1 Egg, room temperature
- 1 ½ teaspoon Vanilla Extract
- 1 teaspoon Molasses

##### Icing

- ½ cup Icing Sugar
- 2 ¼ teaspoons Lemon Juice

##### Instructions:

1. In a bowl, sift and whisk dry ingredients together (EXCEPT sugar).
2. In another bowl, whisk together the wet ingredients (EXCEPT molasses).
3. Stir in the sugar and molasses to the WET ingredients.
4. Stir WET and Dry mixtures together, till just combined and with a dough-like texture.
5. Place the dough on a sheet of plastic wrap. Cover. Shape roughly into a rectangle. Chill for at least 1hr.



##### After the dough is chilled:

1. Preheat oven to 160 C.
2. Line two baking trays with parchment paper.
3. Take the dough from the fridge, unwrap, and place between two separate sheets of plastic wrap.
4. With the dough between the sheets, roll out to desired cookie thickness.

5. Slightly flour the cookie cutter. Press in the dough and make as many cookies as possible. Remember you are trying to recreate the very first Christmas: so making a Mary, Shepard, Jesus, and Angel cookie.



6. Peel away the unused dough.
7. Gently place those cookies on the trays.
8. Reroll the unused dough and repeat steps 10-12. For best results, only reroll twice.
9. Bake for 8-10min. Once removed, cool on baking sheets for 5min before taking off to ice.



#### Icing

1. Mix icing sugar and lemon juice (plus lemon zest if you're keen). You don't have to add all the lemon juice if you want a thicker consistency.
2. Pour icing into a small Ziploc bag, squeeze out any excess air and seal the bag. Cut off a tiny piece of the lower corners of the bag. Carefully squeeze icing through the hole to decorate the cookies. The icing will get harder over time.
3. EAT!!!!

##### 1. Treasure Hunt

Let's go on an adventure to find peace!!

#### You will need:

- Scissors
- Some blue tack
- Printed resource sheet (available below). *Alternative:* write out information by hand on separate pieces of paper OR station someone at each treasure hunt checkpoint. IF DOING IN A CHURCH HALL: adjust clues to be relevant to the space.

#### Instructions:

1. Cut printed resource sheet into squares.
2. Place each clue in the appropriate area around your home. The numbers below correlate with the numbers on the resource sheet:
  - 1) Hand to those playing the game
  - 2) In/around fridge
  - 3) Under a kids' bed
  - 4) Under/around a doormat or front door
  - 5) On/near a light switch
  - 6) On/near a bath or shower
  - 7) On/near a couch
  - 8) In/around a washing machine
  - 9) In/on top of the kids (or any) bible

#### 2. Musical Chairs, with a twist

Just like the puppets, you get to have a party!!!

##### You will need:

- Chairs (one less than the number of kids/players involved)
- Music and a speaker (can use a phone, computer, CD player, etc)

##### Instructions:

1. Set up chairs in a big (socially distanced) circle.
2. Play music and have the kids dance around the circle (and everyone needs to move and groove the whole time the music is playing).
3. Randomly pause music. Once paused, all kids involved need to find a seat. The last person left standing is out and needs to show everyone their best dance move.
4. Remove one chair and start the music again!
5. Repeat steps 2-4 until there is one person left. They are the winner!!!
